On behalf of CA Sri Lanka, the agreement was signed by the Institute President Mr. Jagath Perera and Secretary Mr. Prasanna Liyanage, while Vice Chancellor of the South Eastern University Prof. M. M. M. Najim and Dean - Faculty of Management & Commerce Dr. S Gunapalan signed the MoU on behalf of the university.
